

**Radio Lion** For sixteen years Cellar trustee Shelagh Godwin has been a presenter at Hospital Radio Lion which broadcast to patients at Guildford NHS hospitals and latterly from the Royal Surrey County Hospital. During that time she invited many members of the Cellar and our partner charity Skillway into the studio for interviews, both live and pre-recorded. She is proud to have won awards for Radio Lion from national bodies such as the Christian Broadcasting Council, including a gold for an interview with Dan Eley. A well-known local resident, Dan was paralysed from the chest down following an accident in 2010. He has set up a foundation, with similar aims to Skillway, to help disadvantaged children in Colombia learn technical and vocational skills.

Sadly Shelagh heard in March that Hospital Radio Lion had been given notice to quit its studios. The station stopped broadcasting in the hospital at midnight on Easter Monday. But in Shelagh's own words 'Radio Lion ain't dead yet'. At the time of writing there is a glimmer of hope that another space may be found.



The Cellar recently received a grant so that the Upper Room can be used free of charge by qualified or training counsellors to provide affordable low cost or free counselling. It is now being used regularly – if you know of a counsellor who would like to use the room please get in touch with Debbie at The Cellar. The room is also used for private discussions, prayer and meditation. The Art Club materials are now hidden tidily behind a new blue curtain which enhances the room– many thanks to Maggie Jagger for providing this.
